# hyatt regency coconut point resort & spa

**On Estero Bay in Florida's Gulf Coast, this 26-acre resort sets the scene for productive meetings and teambuilding fun.**

## at work

Meeting planners can take advantage of more than 70,000 square feet of flexible indoor and outdoor function space at the Hyatt Regency Coconut Point. The largest venue is the 14,040-square-foot Calusa Ballroom, which can hold 1,100 attendees for a banquet and is complemented by a 10,494-square-foot terrace. Planners also appreciate the 7,020-square-foot Estero Ballroom and its 5,400-square-foot terrace; two boardrooms with seating for 12 and 18; and several other breakout rooms. The Royal Palm and Cypress Courtyards provide the perfect setting for outdoor events set against the beautiful southwest Florida landscape.

## at rest

Hyatt Regency Coconut Point offers 454 guest rooms, including 28 suites, all showcasing contemporary Florida decor and views of the Bay and the area's lush landscape. Accommodations offer 27-inch (or larger) cable television with DVD player, balcony, mini-fridge,

in-room safe, coffeemaker with complimentary coffee, ceiling fan, and individual air and heating controls. Business-friendly amenities include a work desk, dual-line telephones, voicemail, dataport, and high-speed Internet access.

## at play

Teambuilding activities abound at the Hyatt Regency Coconut Point. Whether it's beach games and kayaking races at the resort's secluded beach island or corporate golf tournaments at the 18-hole championship course designed by Raymond Floyd, it's easy for groups to have fun as they learn to work together. There's also pool and lawn games, tennis courts, bike rentals, ecotours, and sunset cruises. The Stillwater Spa has 18 treatment rooms, a Watsu pool, and a beauty salon, and the fitness center features a cardio theater. Nearby, guests can also shop at Coconut Point, the Miromar outlets, and Fifth Avenue/Third Street in Naples; take in some culture at the Barbara B. Mann Performing Arts Hall and the Philharmonic Center for the Arts; or lay down some bets at area casinos and the Naples/Fort Myers Greyhound Track.

## at the table

A selection of restaurants at the Hyatt Regency Coconut Point will keep guests happy and satiated throughout their stay. Casual options include Braxton's for lunch and cocktails overlooking the 18th hole, poolside dining at Corkscrew, and the 24-hour Kofe Nut. Fine dining is found at the AAA Four Diamond Tanglewood and the Tarpon Bay seafood restaurant, which also features live entertainment. The well-appointed Belvedere Room offers games and afternoon/evening cocktails, and Mangroves features a nightly happy hour right off the lobby.
